GETTING AROUND IN SANTORINI

Villa Agalitsa is close to public transportation and within very close walking distance (less than 1 minute) to Megalochori's lively village square for shopping and dining.

Santorini buses: The bus ticket costs 2.00-2.50 euros (depending on your destination) Check Santorini Buses Timetables here

There is a bus stop very close to the villa. All local buses depart from and finish their route from the Fira Town main hub. Fira Main Bus Station on Google Maps

The longest drive on the island is about 40 minutes to Oia. From Fira to the Airport is a 10 minute drive. From Athinios Ferry Port to Fira is a 20 minute drive.

Taxis are few in Santorini and Uber and Lyft do not exist in Santorini. There are no taxi meters in the taxis and fares are fixed. Always ask in advance what the price will be.


Walking is also a great way to see the island of Santorini on its hiking trails. There are designated hiking paths in the village of Megalochori that go to the famous caldera view of the volcano and through the wine roads and vineyards. There is also a very well known hiking trail that goes from Fira to Oia. Explore Santorini's hiking trails here.







AKROTIRI ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE


Akrotiri is one of the most important prehistoric settlements of the Aegean. The first habitation at the site dates from the Late Neolithic times (at least the 4th millenium B.C.). The town's life came to an abrupt end after the erruption of Santorini's Nea Kameni volcano. The artifacts have been protected up to present and can be viewed at the archealogical site.



ANCIENT THIRA

This 11th century BC Dorian settlement includes remains from Hellenistic, Roman, and Byzantine periods. Ancient Thira is not as accessible as Akrotiri and it is quite a hike or a scenic drive up the mountain to the ruins at the top. This site offers great views of the island from above. Be sure to check the hours of operation before going.





EROS BEACH

On the southern coast of the island, starting at Akrotiri and continuing east to Vlychada, Eros Beach is dominated by the hard white volcanic rock of Santorini in formations reminiscent of a lunar landscape, ending at steep vertical slopes just before the sea. You can rent sunbeds and umbrellas at the beginning of the beach.










VLYCHADA BEACH


Very close to the Tomato Industrial Museum, Vlychada Beach, sometimes known as the "moon beach" or the "moonshaped beach," is known for its lunar shape and scenery surrounded by white cliffs formed by the wind in various shapes. It is a quiet E.U. Blue Flag beach (awarded in 2017), with sunbeds, umbrellas and a small canteen at the beginning.



PERIVOLOS BEACH

Perivolos Beach is the longest black beach of Santorini and is located in close proximity to Perissa beach which is a mere 3 km away. On the beachfront, there are numerous restaurants and bars. Perivolos also offers a plethora of exciting water-sports facilities like scuba diving and jet ski. This beach is very accessible via the bus stop near Villa Agalitsa.



EXO GIALOS BEACH

Exo Gialos Beach is the closest beach to the island's capital, Fira (about 4 km east) and it is considered by locals as Fira's beach. It consists of both black sand and pebbles. You will come across stunning volcanic rock formations here. There's also a small port for fishing boats complete with resident swans and perfect for a stroll at the water's edge.










AMOUDI BAY

Set into the high, red volcanic cliffs of western Santorini below the town of Oia, Amoudi is well known for its waterfront seafood taverns serving fresh fish and traditional Santorinian cuisine. Great for lunch, or dinner while watching the sunset—book 30 minutes in advance of the sunset. For experienced swimmers, cliff jumping at Agios Nicholas here is a must!
